







1856 Halton Grange Runcorn Cheshire (now Runcorn Town Hall). An Italianate mansion built in 1856 for Thomas Johnson a soap manufacturer in the style of Osborne House. The central female head is said to be of Johnson's wife but the same likeness appears elsewhere.

Edwin Clark Litchfield 1815-1885 was a railway entrepreneur - his mansion was also Italianate in style - as were the Prosser mansions in Stuyvesant Heights. Thomas Prosser made his vast fortune by supplying Krupps's weldless railway tires for the U.S. railways.
