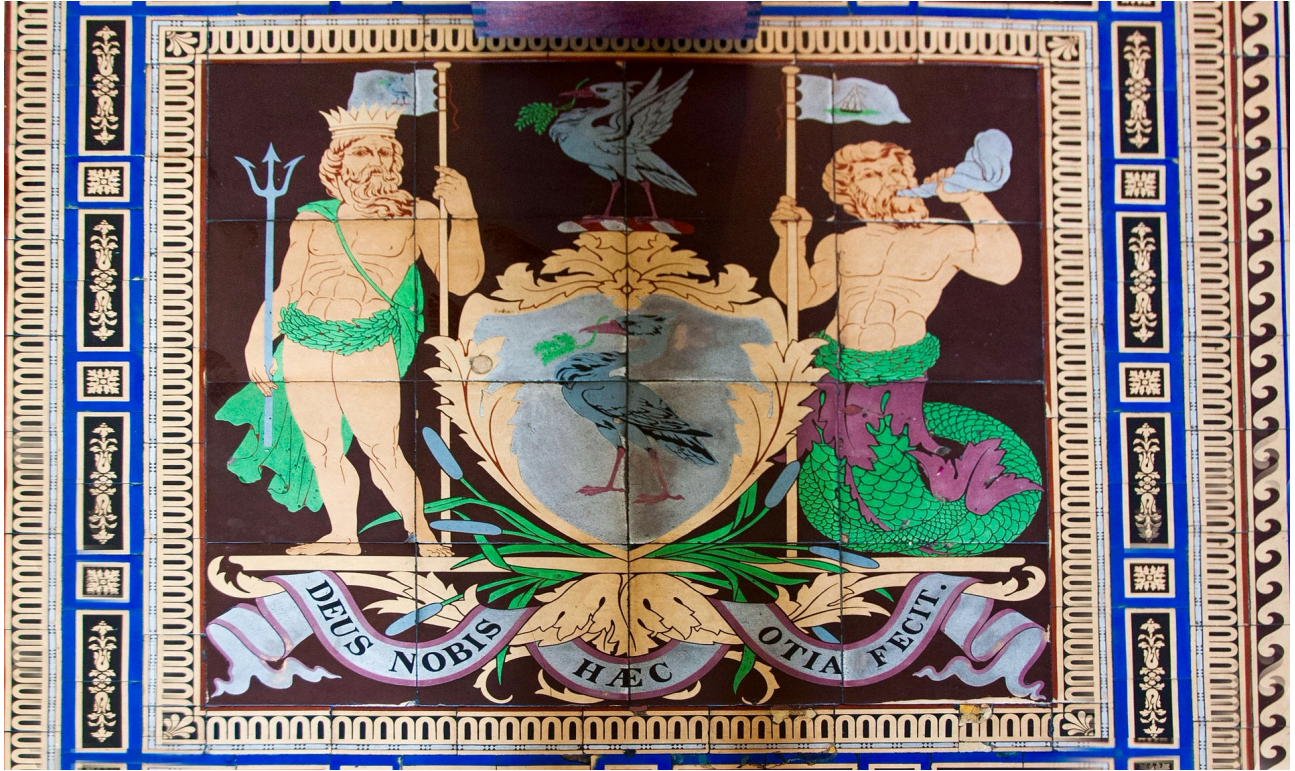
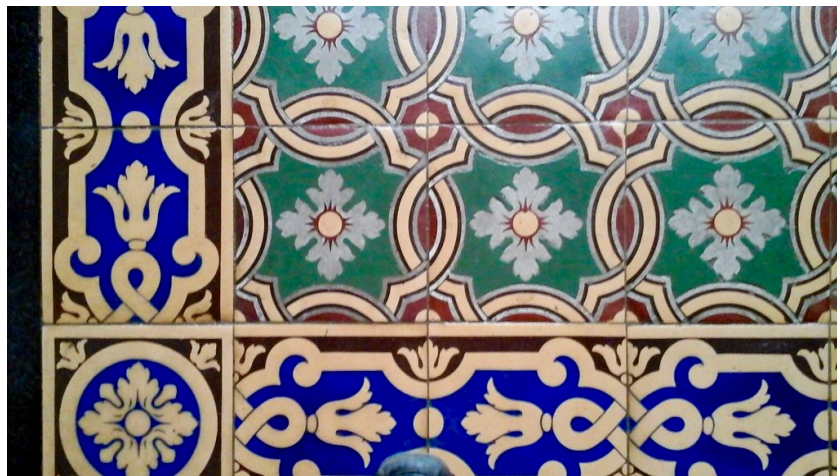

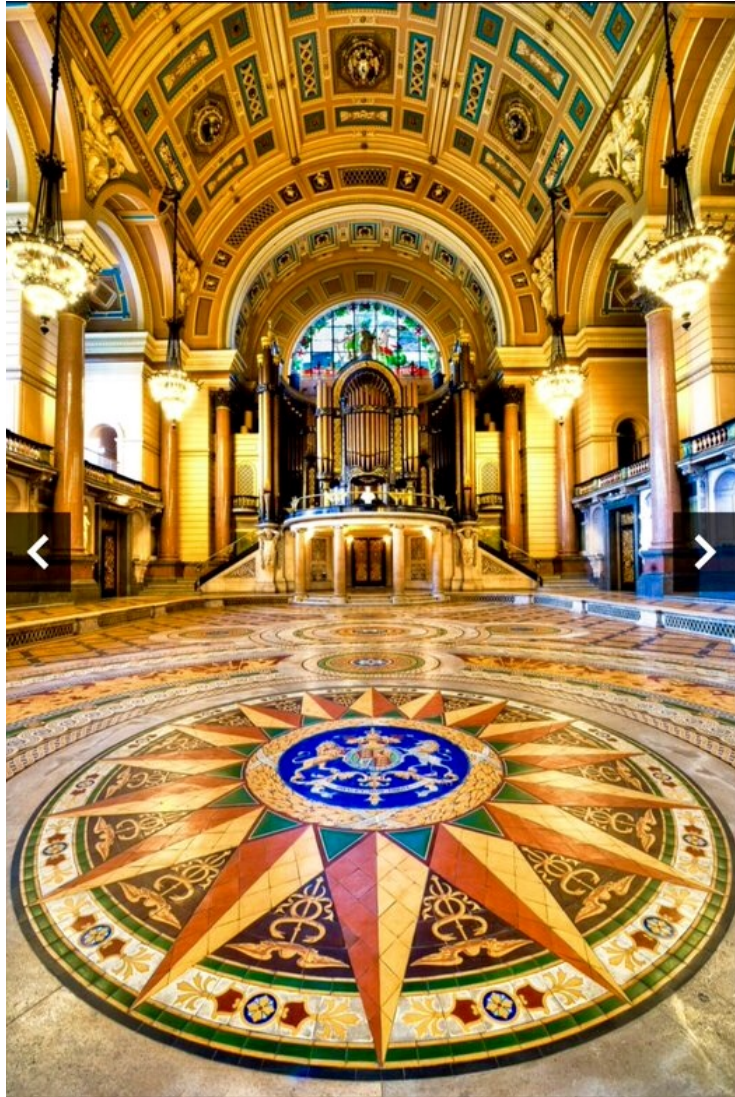

1857 Litchfield Villa Prospect Park Brooklyn New York (renovated)

Edwin Clark Litchfield 1815-1885 was a railway entrepreneur - his mansion was also Italianate in style - as were the Prosser mansions in Stuyvesant Heights. Thomas Prosser made his vast fortune by supplying Krupps's weldless railway tires for the U.S. railways.
