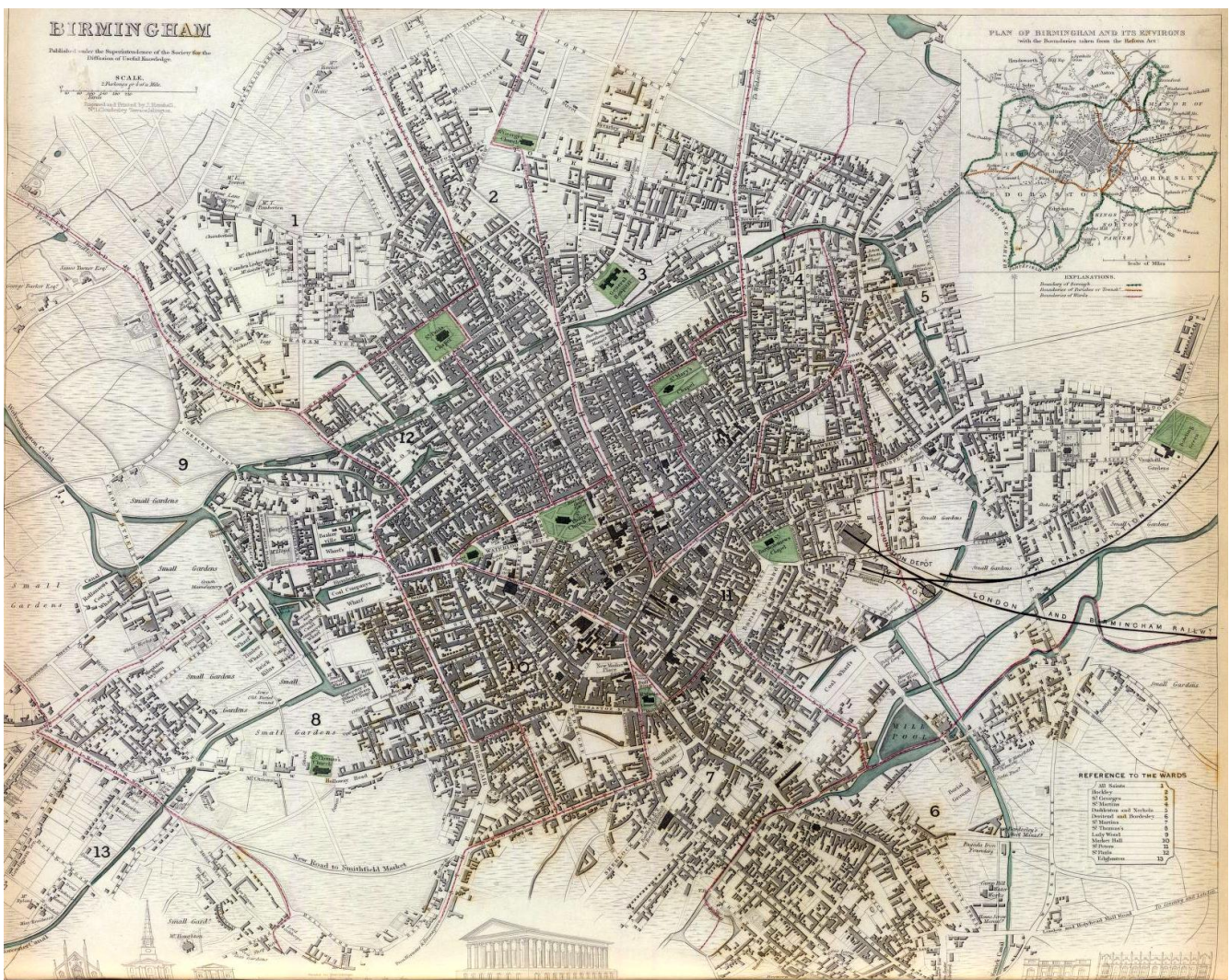


BIRMINGHAM

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Deritend and Bordesley (Bradford and Warwick Streets, Camp Hill, Watery Lane and Coventry Road) are in the lower right section; the Britannia Nail Manufactory (misnamed "Mr Winford's") is in the top right; Cherry Street is in the middle just below St. Philip's Church; Broad Street and the Cambridge Street Works are middle left.
